## 2009 ANNUAL REPORT MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS

#### **JANUARY**

In January the E.T.S.B. (911 Board) and police department installed new fire and ambulance service receivers that are attached to the logging recorder. This new technology allows us to record "real time" radio transmissions on those frequencies. In interest of the safety of fire and ambulance personnel and as a means to protect everyone in the event of litigation, we now can accurately record their operations and protect us from unfounded complaints. This upgrade is part of the ETSB and our ongoing radio infrastructure upgrades.

#### **FEBRUARY**

During the month of February the E.T.S.B. and the police department continued work towards the city wide communications upgrade. The upgrade has been a work in progress for over two years. This month we completed installation of a "Sentra Voice Unit" that monitors the radio communications system for the police department, fire department, ambulance service and the public works/electric department communication frequencies. The unit constantly monitors the various parts of the system and in the event of either a catastrophic or partial failure in any link within the system a computerized radio message is announced with the type of failure and at the same time a pager is tripped and the message is announced in the emergency dispatch center at the police department. The unit will detect many potential issues including power failures, fiber optic cuts and UPS issues within the system. In the event of a failure we now will be immediately alerted to a potential problem, can move over to the backup radio system installed last year and at the same time cause for our communications vendor and city electric department personnel to coordinate any necessary repairs. Being notified of a potential problem before an unforeseen event is clearly in the best interest of public safety.

On February 24<sup>th</sup> Matt Heiden, a former Spring Valley Police Officer and LaSalle County Deputy Sheriff joined our force. Matt is a veteran of the US Military and had a bachelor's degree in Law Enforcement from Western Illinois University. He and his wife Corri are the parents of four children. Matt was hired to replace retiring Sergeant Derek Benning.

#### MARCH

At the March, 2009 annual meeting of the Illinois Valley Chiefs of Police Association Peru resident Paul Ochs was honored as "Citizen of the Year". We nominated Mr. Ochs after an incident where he noticed some "suspicious" activity in his north Peru neighborhood. As a good neighbor he investigated further. As result of his observations he detected a residential burglary in progress. He notified the home homeowner and called 911. Four suspects fled the home in a vehicle and were pursued by the homeowner and Mr. Ochs who all the while was on 911 with a Peru telecommunicator. Several Peru and LaSalle officers were able to stop the suspects and arrest 4 out of state men for the burglary. It was then determined that the men were implicated in a yet to be discovered residential burglary of a LaSalle home earlier in the day.

#### MAY

Sergeant Derek Benning retired after a long and distinguished career as a member of the Peru Police Department.

Copies of DUI Enforcement Awards from AAIM (Alliance Against Intoxicated Motorists) for Sgt. Raymond and Officers Conness, Biagioni, Bentley, and Brown are attached to this report.

During May, the police and fire department took delivery of new portable radios purchased by the City of Peru ETSB. The ambulance service is now using the radios formerly used by our police officers. The purchase now completes a nearly three year radio and radio infrastructure upgrade for the City of Peru Public Safety Agencies.

Special thanks are in order for the members of the City of Peru ETSB. They are Joe Hogan, Gary Eccles, Doug Bernabei, Richard Vlastnik, James Dellinger and Robert Pyszka.

#### SEPTEMBER

As you are aware, in September we took delivery of a Kustom Signal Smart Speed Trailer. The trailer will display the speed of vehicles in traffic. As you are probably also aware the unit has been used at numerous locations in the City of Peru. Starting with this monthly report we will provide a log of the various locations the unit has been in use. There are specific areas that we will be using the trailer extensively to conduct further traffic studies to help determine if additional traffic control or change in speed limits etc. are in order. One area that will be further studied is Marquette Road. The trailer has a computer on board that will provide us with 24 hour a day data with speeds, time of day and other data. This will help us tremendously in our traffic studies. Just as important the trailer is a great educational tool because the mere presence will likely in itself help get voluntary compliance from the motoring public in reducing speed. We appreciate your allocating the funds for this equipment.

#### OCTOBER

We recently received a \$1600.00 grant to be used to furnish bullet proof vests for our police officers. As you can see since 2006, we have now received nearly \$4000.00 in vest grants. As you are aware, we provide our officers bullet proof vests which typically have a 5 year life. We have created a program where we replace an equal number of vests each year over a 5 year period with this program. This replacement cycle, coupled with the grant monies allows for the least possible financial impact on our general fund as opposed to a mass purchase. We will continue to seek these grant dollars.
